- **Improved data quality:** Organizations must improve the quality of their data due to e-invoicing. Previously overlooked granular pieces of information are now collected and documented, allowing for more informed business decisions based on reliable data.
- **Management-level data insights:** The abundance of granular data points captured by e-invoicing can also provide management with valuable insights into their business operations.

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- **Financial forecasting:** The availability of more data points enables organizations to create accurate financial forecasts, reducing uncertainty in financial planning and budgeting.
- **Scenario planning:** E-invoicing data can be leveraged for scenario planning, allowing businesses to simulate various situations and make informed decisions based on real data, leading to more effective risk management.

What are some of the top benefits businesses realize from e-invoicing in terms of managing risk and improving audits?

Shifting away from manual data transfer and reporting processes minimizes errors. It provides helpful information for businesses that operate in multiple countries with multiple currencies and supports communications with stakeholders. It also reduces the time it takes to generate external or internal reports and permits better management of cash flow. Reconciliation efforts or audit defenses for taxing jurisdictions are less costly in terms of effort, time, and money spent. Audits may be completed faster and required less frequently. It also streamlines compliance around archiving needs.

In terms of the Vertex e-invoicing solution, what are some of its most noteworthy features?

Vertex has built a single platform that helps manage the VAT and e-invoicing reporting processes. It allows businesses to streamline VAT compliance and reporting activities and monitor the statuses of transactions, as well as make necessary reconciliations. What types of organizations are likely to benefit most from the Vertex approach?

Primarily, businesses operating with the business-to-business (B2B) model stand to gain the most from the Vertex approach, particularly in regions where e-invoicing has been mandated by the government. Compliance with VAT or goods and services tax (GST) regulations in such countries becomes mandatory, necessitating the use of technologies like those offered by Vertex. These obligations apply to a wide range of businesses, including those with relatively modest turnovers, such as those with thresholds as low as £80,000 in the UK or €15,000 in certain EU countries.

Furthermore, organizations that operate on a global scale or engage with customers from various countries can more efficiently manage their tax compliance. In addition, entities that conduct business with government agencies (B2G) will benefit from Vertex's capabilities which enhance their ability to reduce fraud, improve cash flow, and gain visibility into business transactions – all key objectives of both government agencies and tax authorities.
