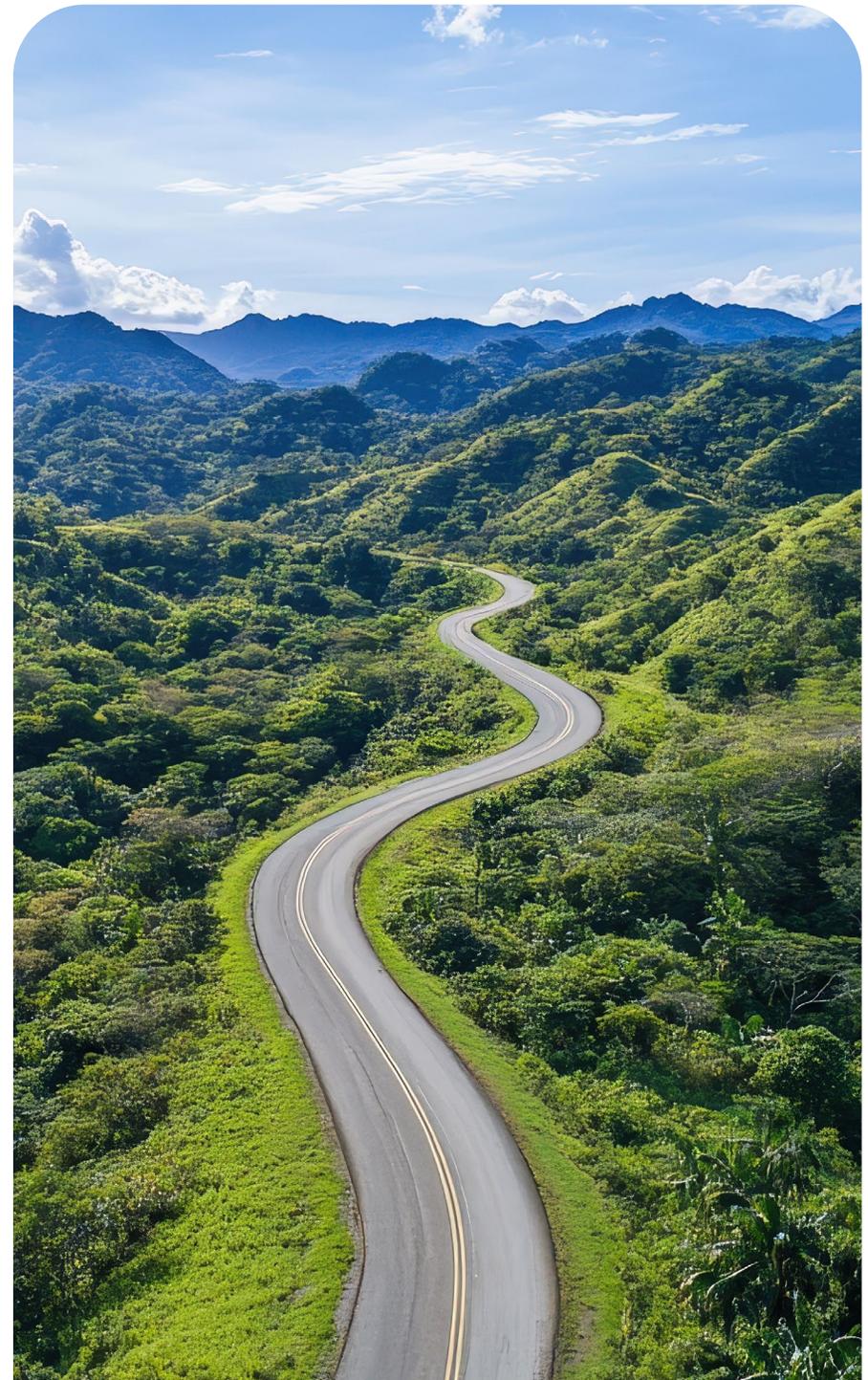


Understanding the Tax Landscape

The Complexity of Sales and Use Tax

The U.S. tax landscape presents unique challenges that can overwhelm even the most sophisticated businesses:

- **Jurisdiction Identification:** With over 12,000 separate taxing jurisdictions in the United States alone, determining the correct taxing jurisdiction is no simple task. These boundaries rarely match zip codes, adding another layer of complexity.
- **Nexus Rules:** The obligation of a business to charge sales tax in a jurisdiction can be based on physical or economic nexus, or both. Each jurisdiction has their own specific nexus rules which sellers must comply with or incur penalties. This requires continual monitoring of nexus rules as well as sales volumes.
- **Taxing Complications:** U.S. sales tax rates vary widely, with state level sales tax often layered upon additional local sales taxes, creating a complex matrix of rates to navigate.
- **U.S. Classifications:** Tax classifications are based on exact locations with constantly shifting boundaries. Rates rise and fall, exemptions come and go, and tax holidays appear temporarily—all requiring vigilant monitoring to ensure the correct tax is charged to stay compliant.
- **High Volume Transactions:** Peak selling days, like Black Friday and Cyber Monday, that exponentially increase the transaction volume put added strain on network connections that are critical to delivering frictionless sales tax calculations in e-commerce transactions.



The Complexity of VAT

For e-commerce businesses operating outside the US, VAT and GST present their own set of challenges:

- **VAT Registration:** Almost all non-EU companies must register as non-resident VAT traders in at least one EU country, requiring familiarity with each country's specific registration requirements.
- **VAT Thresholds:** Each EU member country sets its own distance selling registration threshold, creating a patchwork of compliance requirements for sellers or the non-resident business to meet the criteria of a single VAT registration and enable multi-jurisdiction tax declaration schemes referred to as 'One-Stop-Shop' schemes. The former processes would still have to be applied for selling into countries such as the UK, Norway or Switzerland.
- **VAT Determination:** Multiple factors drive VAT determination, including whether a transaction is B2B or B2C, what is the deemed nature of goods or services being supplied as per country-by-country legal interpretation, where the supplier is established versus where the warehouse location and intermediary supplier may be based, where the end customer is based, and where the goods supply is deemed to be have been completed.
- **VAT Invoicing:** Any transaction liable to VAT must be invoiced in a specific format required by the EU's VAT directive, necessitating customized documentation for compliant invoicing. And some countries have additional mandates for e-invoicing submission and approvals such as Italy, Poland Germany and very soon many more countries such as France, Spain and Belgium.
- **VAT Returns:** EU member states have different return form requirements and reporting calendars, creating a complex compliance schedule for businesses operating across multiple countries to submit and ensure timely payments are executed in local currencies.



Common Tax Challenges for Shopify Merchants

Tax Collection Responsibilities

Shopify merchants bear the responsibility to:

- Charge appropriate taxes on sales
- Report and remit those taxes to the appropriate government authorities
- Stay current with frequently changing tax laws and regulations
- Set up tax overrides for default setting to help address unique tax situations

While Shopify can be configured to handle common SUT, GST and VAT calculations, the ultimate responsibility for accurate compliance rests with the seller. The business must be registered with local or federal tax authorities as required in order to help ensure accurate collection and tax remittance.

- Rules vary by state and jurisdiction, requiring constant vigilance
- Non-compliance can result in penalties or legal action

Shipping and Freight Taxability

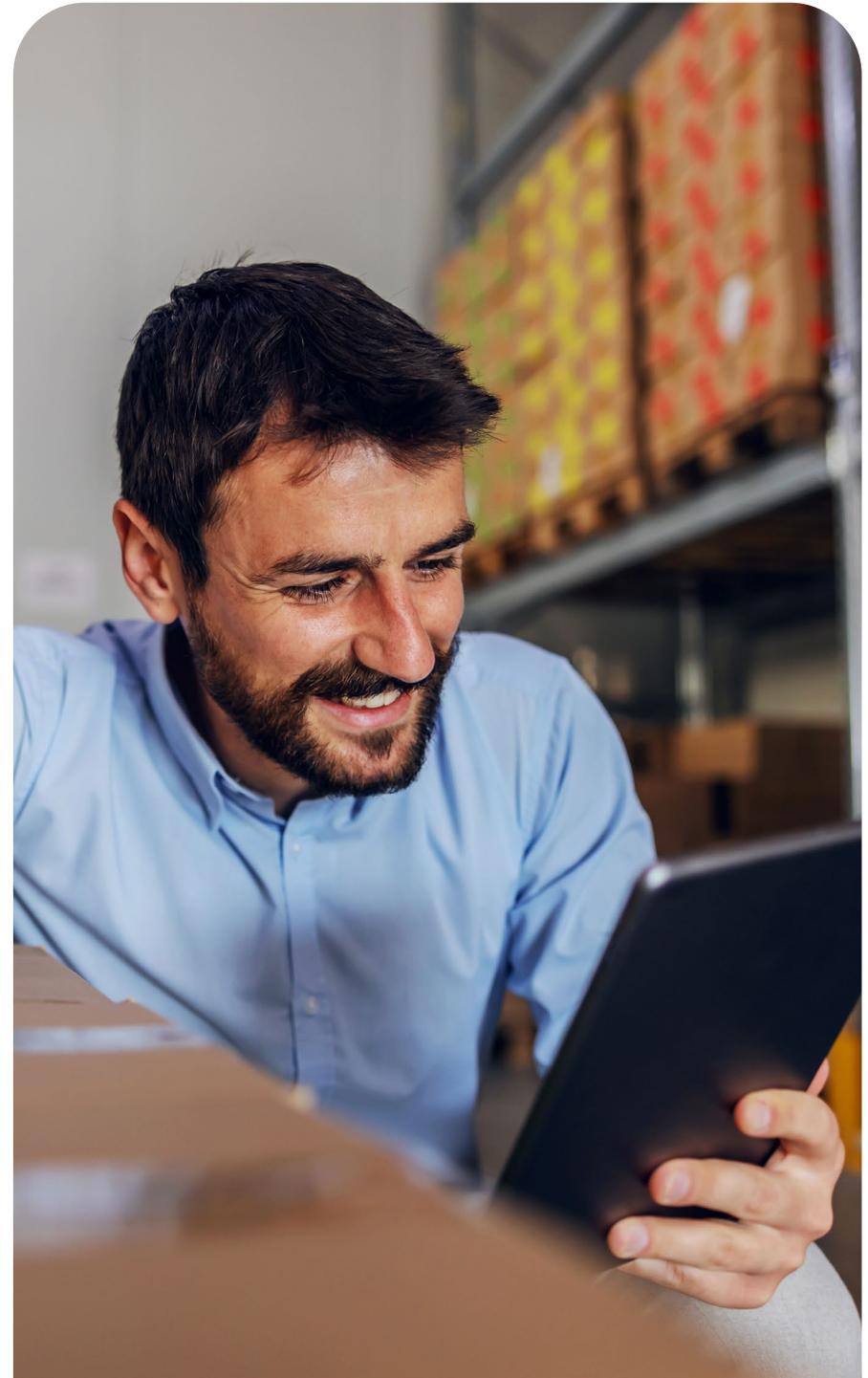
The taxability of shipping and freight charges varies significantly across jurisdictions:

- Each state has its own statutes and regulations regarding shipping charges
- Most states consider freight and shipping charges part of gross receipts or sales price, making them taxable
- Some states never apply sales tax to shipping charges
- Determining the correct approach for each transaction requires detailed knowledge of local regulations

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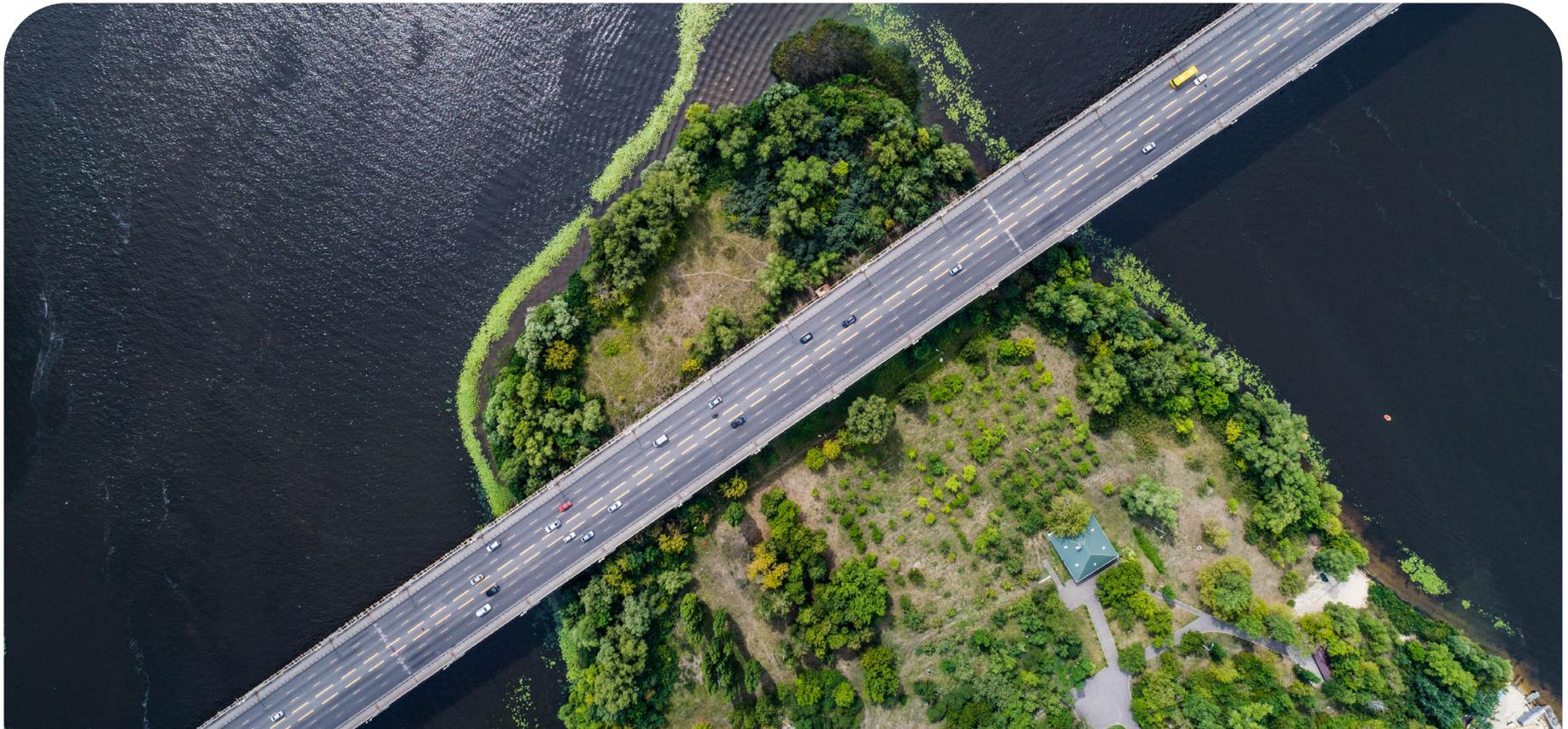
International Expansion
